How to find us:

Bus — If you purchase a ticket for the Hop on/off Bus, get off at Mill Cottage, Flinders Park bus stop.

Walking — Allow 10—15 min from the Post Office

Mill Cottage Museum Allow 30-45 min on site.

Built in 1866 for the pioneering Bishop family, it contains 100 years of family possessions. Also on show is the Pioneers and Descendents Club collection of interesting and varied memorabilia from early Port Lincoln. Open from 10am-3pm on Cruise Ship days

Entry fee \$8.00 or \$6.00 concession per person. Electronic payment available.

The Old Mill Lookout Allow 10-15 min on site.

This local landmark, built in 1846, was never completed. The land on which it stands was later purchased by John Bishop, and being the only building on the property when Mill Cottage was built, gave the cottage its name.

Walking directions (see map over the page)

Walk along the foreshore until you reach the very easily seen landmark, the Port Lincoln Hotel.

Turn left on Light St, & walk up to and over the roundabout. Continue up the hill till you come to Flinders Park (5-7 min).

You will see Mill Cottage Museum in its beautiful garden and parkland setting. Come in for a tour.

If you would like to visit the Old Mill, follow the map, or ask a Mill Cottage guide for final directions.

After your visit, walk across the park to Flinders Highway and down the hill back to the foreshore.

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
